

Bringing your child to worship and help him/her both become comfortable with the place and enjoy the time there;

Introducing them SLOWLY to the practice of Holy Communion and being watchful over their reaction and behavior around Holy Communion.


Pockets of Hope provides these children with new backpacks filled with personal care items they need, and comfort items they can call their own.




NEWEST WAYS TO CONNECT WITH YOUR FAITH

"Take 10" with your Family

"Take Ten" stands for taking just 10 minutes every day to connect with your family and talk about faith.



- High's and Low's- Everyone takes a turn sharing one low and one high for the day.
- Scripture/Bible Story/Faith Story- Read a Bible story from a Bible Storybook or any Bible depending on the age of your children. Or, you may choose to read a favorite scripture passage or the passage connected with this week's worship experience. Or, share a story of your faith journey with your children.
- 3. Prayer- Take turns leading/offering a prayer each day. Or, use a prayer that has been passed down from your family.
- 4. Blessing- Invite everyone to make the sign of the cross on the forehead of everyone whom you are gathered with and offer a simple blessing. It could be the same blessing every day or you can take turns creating the blessing of the day. One example- "May God bless you and keep you."



You may have seen a couple of items in the entry way to church on Sunday morning. We are inviting families to take a pocket cross, or a military



soldier toy and keep them close to remind you to pray for those around us. We invite and encourage you to find news ways to add prayer to part of your daily routine and make faith a part of your home. This is an easy reminder to pray for those serving in the military and to pray for those around us throughout our day.

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DAVE

DECEMBER-ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS FESTIVAL MONTH

Grace and Peace to you all for the month of December. It is a month that brings us Advent and Christmas. It is a new Church Year when we begin the season of Advent. Our scripture themes this month are: a fiery furnace of life; valley of dry bones; thirst quenching waters; the Word dwelling among us with grace and truth; and John the Baptist crying in the wilderness. Advent themes also include: stay awake; Christ will come again; my soul magnifies the Lord and more.

You are probably aware that Advent and Christmas are the two shortest seasons of the Church Year. I hope you look forward to them as much as I do. Sometimes, Advent can get pushed out because of all of us (church and society) who are pushing for Christmas. I remember a pastor many years ago who decided to start Advent two weeks early. He thought it would give a full four weeks for the season of Advent and then look to the Christmas season two weeks earlier. He mentioned that it can be the tension like you have on a violin—both ends giving a tension that makes music for our ears. I appreciate his example and his perspective.

We have challenges and joys as we move through Advent and to Christmas. Here is a question for you to ask this Advent/Christmas time. What is the difference between hope and optimism? Do they overlap? December 6, I will have been here at S. Santiago for 6 months. I am so thankful for this time I have been able to see you in action as a Mission Outpost Congregation here in northwestern Sherburne County. Blessings on your journey forward. My spouse, Catherine, and I want to wish you a very blessed season of Advent and Christmas as together we are people of hope for theses seasons and the new year ahead. Take the gifts that God has given you and go and share them with the world–Go in the name of the Christ Child, Go in Christ's Peace—


