LENTEN PRACTICES



For nearly two thousand years the 40-day season of Lent has been used by God's people to remember the events of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Christians throughout the ages have chosen to take on disciplines to keep them centered on God all the way to Easter. We encourage you to take on these daily spiritual practices as well, which can help protect from distraction and increase our ability to hear from God. May we all be transformed as we participate in these exercises of grace.

Monday: Make no purchases.

Most of us can buy things whenever we need them. Take a day to fast from purchases. Examples: Make your lunch instead of buying it. Fill your gas tank on another day. Avoid the vending machine. As you do, pray for those who go without. "Dear Lord, I have all that I need and more. Bless those who go without. Amen."

Tuesday: Make a personal contact. Our lives can be so busy. Many of us are in such a rush that we don't have time for relationships. Examples: Write and send a hand-written note. Make a phone call to an old friend. Have people over for a meal. As you do, encourage them in the Lord or thank them for their influence in your life: remember that God has promised to be with you.

Wednesday: Fast from noise. For many of us, we are constantly barraged with noise from our T.V., radio, or iPod. Our lives are also bombarded with distractions through social media and advertisement. Embrace silence so that God's voice may be loud in your life. Examples: Turn off your car radio. Take a break from social media. Keep the television off.

As you do, sing a worship song, or speak out your prayers, and listen for God's still small voice.

Thursday: Add an extra hour of sleep. We are designed to need sleep. Rest is one of the greatest gifts God gives us. Some of us are exhausted from burning the candle at both ends. Be thankful for God's goodness by going to bed an hour early. If you can't sleep, lie in bed and read the scriptures or pray for the needs of others. (Our Taking God's Story Home provides suggestions for scripture text to read.)

Friday: **Fast a food of your choice.** It is easy to become addicted to sweets, caffeine, and constant eating. Recognize your dependence on God, and be thankful for the things you enjoy by choosing to fast a meal or a food of choice. As you do, focus on your dependence on God for your most basic needs. "Heavenly Father, your Son is the bread of life. Feed my heart and soul that I may have peace. Amen."

Saturday: Add an hour of physical activity. When we take care of our bodies we take care of the temple of the Holy Spirit. Examples: Go for a walk. Swim a few laps at the YMCA. As you do, pray for those who are suffering from disease or sickness, and thank God for the gift of life and the health you have.

Sunday: Celebrate in worship! Participate in the 8:00 or 10:30 service!

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE

Jesus said, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink.

As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'"

(John 7:37-38)

"Is anyone thirsty? Come and drink—even if you have no money! Come, take your choice of wine or milk—it's all free!

Why spend your money on food that does not give you strength?
Why pay for food that does you no good? Listen to me, and you will eat what is good. (Isaiah 55:1-2)

"Please, sir," the woman said, "give me this water! Then I'll never be thirsty again..."
(John 4:15)

I used to bake all of our family's bread. Now before you think much more me of than you should... Or before you roll your eyes... you have to know that I had a particularly fine bread machine. It was the most effortless homemade bread you could have! I could program the timer on it. I could throw in the ingredients at night. It would do all the work for me, and we would wake up with nice, wholesome, "beefy" baked bread. And I mean, this was BEEFY bread—cracked wheat and rolled oats and honey and whole wheat flour...mmmmmmmm.

Since my machine gave up the ghost, we have been back to eating "store bread" for a little a while now. And it works for us. Sort of. It toasts just fine. And it holds the contents of a sandwich just fine. But I can't really say that it quite satisfies in the same way as that baked bread did.

I wonder if that is what is at the heart of the Bible readings above? I detect a sense throughout that there is "something" upon which we human beings figuratively eat and drink. But I also detect a sense of need, of want, or of dissatisfaction, of thirst, of a quest for something that addresses that need, satisfies our want, and quenches our thirsts. The language is earthy and common, wine, milk, and water. But those common things have a fine, abundant, rich, and satisfactory quality to them. "Please, sir," the woman at the well pleads, "give me this water! Then I'll never be thirsty again!" The story continues to unfold not only with this woman in John 4 but throughout the Gospel of John as a whole. Jesus says, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and the one who believes in me drink...". Again and again, people encounter Jesus, have a sip or even a deep chugalug of the draught he offers, and they are sustained, quenched, healed, strengthened, renewed, overjoyed, and more!

I think that this is what not only the practices of Lent are all about (Lent begins **Wednesday**, **March 5**, with our **Ash Wednesday observances**); this is what our daily practice of faith is supposed to be all about: encountering Jesus; having a sip or even a deep chugalug of the draught he offers, so that we are sustained, quenched, healed, strengthened, renewed, overjoyed, and more! At one of our Wednesday Adult 4-Key Faith Practice sessions, one of our dads put it this way when asked to describe how the image of Living Water spoke to him: "When I have a long, hard day at work and nothing seems right, sometimes just coming home and having a shower makes me feel like a new man." **THAT'S IT EXACTLY, I THINK!** Our entire human race seems to be looking for something, to be made new. And that search seems to be even more magnified in our Western culture with all of its technology and trapping and but remnants of deep, spiritual, satisfying practices. The Irish supergroup U2, fronted by the devoutly Christian Bono, may have written the anthem of era: "I still haven't found what I'm looking for."

Jesus is the Living Water. Jesus is the Bread of Life. These proclamations serve as the foundation for our Christian proclamation and identity. **The question still may be, "Yeah, but HOW do I drink of this Living Water? HOW do I get my hands on this Bread?"** (That's the request of the woman at the well.) I believe that things like our suggested "Lenten Practices" are places where Jesus might meet us. Every single week, we are invited into common, habit-forming faith practices—4 Key Faith Practices of Caring Conversation, Devotion & Prayer, Service, and Daily Ritual—that might be places where we drink and eat deeply of Jesus' presence. If your household is not in the habit of these, choose ONE, and practice it during Lent. **But as you do, always ask yourself: "What am I hearing/experiencing/tasting of God's love through Christ Jesus by doing this?"** I believe that question will be answered ABUNDANTLY for you, in ways that fill hearts and minds like homemade bread fills hungry bellies!

Jessica made a motion to accept the Consent Agenda, seconded by Kim, motion passed.


COMMITTEE REVIEW:

Closed with the Lord's Prayer.



Caring Conversations:

Take some time to reflect this month on how you first learned about faith. Who was it that first taught you to practice the faith? Has faith in God always





As we enter into Lent our hope is to find deeper connection with God in our everyday actions. To devote ourselves to reading scripture, praying for one another, and growing deeper in our understanding of faith. As you read 1 Timothy 4 we would invite you into asking a few questions this month.

What word or phrase sticks out in the reading this month?

What is God reminding me of, or asking me to chew on throughout this month?

What type of action is God asking me to take this month for myself and for the young person I am praying for?

Ritual and Tradition:

Consider taking a moment this month to create a space, a time, or an opportunity to focus your prayers for the young person you are praying for. Consider an alarm on a phone, or a certain time a day to lift up that student in prayer. Maybe lighting a candle to focus your energy on prayer for your prayer partner.

Service:

What ways can you encourage the life of faith of your prayer partner this month? How could you be the example to them as others have been the example for you? Take a few moments to send a note, write a letter, or make a personal connection to your student this month. What words of encouragement could you offer to them?
