

Dear church family and friends in Christ,

As you are likely aware, on March 25, Gov. Tim Walz signed three executive orders, which can be summarized as follows:

The state of MN is under a "Stay Home" order from Friday, March 27, 11:59PM through Friday, April 10, 5:00PM. This order may be extended.

Closure of bars, restaurants, etc. has been extended through May 1.

Schools will implement distance learning plans through May 4.

Your church council met virtually on Thursday night, March 26, to discuss the shifting situation. It was decided that SSLC will respond to these new executive orders in the following ways:

For the duration of the "Stay Home" order (now ending April 10), the church building will be completely closed. There will be no office hours. All staff will remain home, doing whatever work they can remotely. Pastors will come to the building only to record services, as allowed by the executive order (EO 20-20, section 6v).

After the "Stay Home" order is lifted, **SSLC services and activities will continue to be suspended through May 3.** However, at that time, full staff will return to the office on Mondays only, 8AM - 3PM.

*We have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding. - Colossians 1:9*

The extension of our church closure is perhaps not surprising, but we recognize how difficult it is to not be able to gather with one another in our sanctuary. It's tough for us pastors too. The hard truth is that this situation is likely to get worse before it gets better, in a variety of ways.

Know that Pastor Hollie and I are praying for you. We will be trying to connect individually with each one of you in the coming weeks, and as always, we are available anytime by phone, text or email. As needs arise – spiritual, emotional, physical, financial – please don't hesitate to let us know!

**We will continue to hold services virtually from now through May 3. This includes Sundays, the remaining Wednesday in Lent, and Wednesdays after Easter. These services will be posted to our website (sslcmn.org) as well as our Facebook page.** We will also continue to post daily devotionals, as well as explore some new ways to keep us connected and feed our spirits during this time.

As I have been connecting with people this past week, I've been inspired by how many responses of, "I'm fine, does anyone else need help?" I received. We are now, as we have been, a church willing and ready to come together in service and in love. In the coming months, that communal spirit will likely be put to the test. But I am confident in the steadfast love and care of our God, who will carry us through these trying times. Let us rest in that promise. Let us reach out to those around us in whatever ways we can. And let us continue to be church together in the face of this pandemic.

### Some detailed effects of the extended church suspension:

Holy Week services: Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday will be held online. At-home materials and/or other services will be provided for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

First Communion Sunday (originally April 19) will be postponed. At least one opportunity for First Communion will be provided this summer as well as next fall.

"It's a Girl Thing" brunch (originally April 25) is postponed.

Confirmation of this year's ninth grade class (originally May 3) will be postponed until the fall. Traditionally, fall confirmations are held on the Sunday observation of Reformation Day. Therefore, confirmation is tentatively scheduled for October 25, 2020.

## MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Greetings to our entire, beloved SSLC congregation!

First and foremost, I hope and pray that you are all healthy and that you have been able to maintain a solid relationship with God and your family these past couple of weeks. I also pray that you have been able to maintain a little bit of sanity along the way, in this this rather insane situation we find ourselves and our world in right now! After all, when you boil it all down, isn't our health, our relationship with God and with our families the most important aspects of life itself!

The problem with this is that many of us only drop money in the plate as it is passed around to us. We aren't there to "see" the church in operation so it must not be happening. It's shut down. It's not functioning. It's closed.

But we are NOT closed! Only our doors are closed. God is very much at work, as are our wonderful pastors! I can feel God at work in all us as a council. Every council member cares, contributes, and is physically and emotionally present at our meetings and only wants and desires what is best for the entire congregation. And I can surely feel God at work in our beautiful pastors that we are so blessed to have working with us and along side us during this most difficult time! I can assure you that they also want only what's best for all of us as a congregation and are willing to work towards that goal. We are so blessed to have not only one, but TWO such wonderful, caring, compassionate, hard working pastors that go above and beyond the call of duty in this unprecedented situation we find ourselves faced with. Believe me, they are putting in many unseen hours of work to bring us the wonderful online services, songs, devotionals, and confirmation youth work that you see on our church's website.

With all that being said, I know that we all are, individually, knee deep in this global pandemic ourselves. 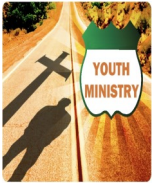

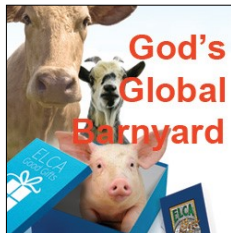

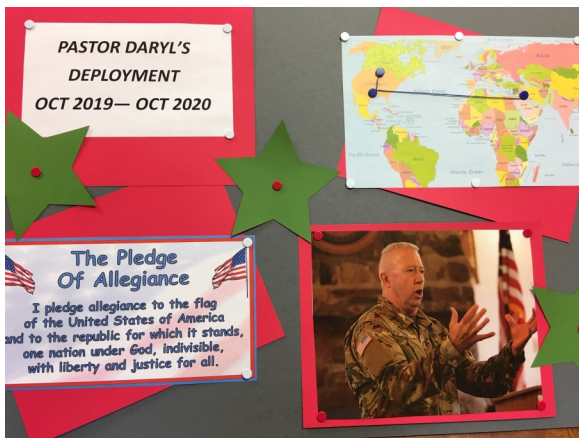
