Confirmation Sunday

April 11th will be a Sunday to celebrate, as six of our ninth graders will be affirming the promises that were made by God at their baptisms and take on the vows that were made on their behalf by their parents, godparents and families. This year's confirmands include Trevor Handshoe, Maddie Doucette, Jaci Heitkamp, Sammie Mekeland, Braden Koenig and Reid McCalla.

We have arranged for a photographer to join us for the morning and will take pictures of our Confirmands, as well as a group photograph of them all. It is our intention to celebrate these six young men and women at both the 9 a.m. (Drive-In) and 10 a.m. (Sanctuary) Services. Please arrive no later than 8:45 a.m. so your student can put on their robes and get their picture taken. At 9:15 a.m., Pastor Thul will broadcast the Faith Statements and the students will participate in the Sacrament of Holy Communion with the assembly. After worship, anyone who did not get their picture taken can do so in the sanctuary, and then a group photo will be taken, as well. The full Affirmation of Baptism rite will be part of the 10 a.m. Sanctuary Service. The students' faith statement videos will be shown.



Gratitude Sunday

Book of Revelation

Overview and Bible Study

Starts April 6, 2021 at 7 p.m. via Zoom video and audio.

This means SSLC members can call in and participate or Zoom in and learn, as well. We will be utilizing a 7-week course produced by one of Pastor Thul's seminary professors, Dr. Craig Koester. Even in Martin Luther's era, more than 500 years ago, most Bible experts thought Revelation was a dangerous place for average church attendees to go – especially because the imagery and the prophetic nature of the book itself can easily lead to misinterpretation and misuse.

We will deal with things like the Rapture and the idea behind the Left Behind Series. More importantly, we will get into the message that the Holy Spirit was conveying to the seven churches when it was originally written, as well as the message the Spirit is sending us today.

Chaplain Thul



As you know, Pastor Thul returned from Iraq about four months ago as the Chaplain for the 34th Combat Aviation Brigade. Army Regulations require that the Minnesota National Guard basically leave Soldiers alone for the first 90 days after they come off terminal leave. This gives them a chance to connect with their families and their civilian work before returning to their peacetime role as a Citizen-Soldier.

Thul's 90 days are up, and he has begun training one weekend a month, as well as leading training on Applied Suicide Intervention Skills. He will also be involved in various Strong Bonds Family Retreats as soon as the Army gives clearance to once again hold them in person. His Annual Training is scheduled for the latter half of June.

The SSLC Church Council is in the process of updating its site survey and will soon begin looking to fill the Associate Pastor position. This should alleviate some of the stressors involved with Thul's military service – as well as the fact that there is too much going on around these parts for one pastor to effectively manage.

Love & Logic: A Seminar for the Whole Family



Kids are a blessing from above – but it certainly doesn't always seem that way. SSLC will offer a special class for parents over the course of five Sunday evenings, starting at 5 p.m. on April 18th in the narthex. Kids can either sit through the video and discussion training or can be shipped off to hang out with our Youth Volunteers who will be available at the church to watch them. Background: More than 20 years ago, Pastor Jennifer became a certified "Love & Logic" instructor and taught the class to dozens of Families over the years through Community Ed and her Congregations. While deployed, Chaplain Thul realized that most of his Soldiers would be going home to a world that, quite frankly, had changed in ways that we could not even imagine. Truth is: If the Soldier's Family was still standing when mom/dad got home, they obviously did something right and the last thing they needed was a drill sergeant to come in and bark. So Chaplain Thul got certified, too.

Seminar Dates are April 18 and 25, as well as May 2, 9 and 16. Each session will last 90 minutes or so, and will begin with supper. Cost is \$25 per Family. SSLC will provide the main dish for the potluck (hot dogs and brats, sloppy joes, tater tot hotdish, chili and Surprise!) Families are invited to bring a side dish of their choice. 
Worship Dates and Times


POCKETS OF HOPE


