## A Love Letter

One of my favorite things to do in all of the world is to be a part of the Sacrament of Baptism. I'm not normally a robe and alb and super high church kind of pastor or chaplain, but when it comes to this incredibly holy moment, I would not be against an incense burner or even strobe lights: It is so incredible that God claims us.

You know how preschoolers can get so happy that it overwhelms their bodies? Or Minnesota Vikings fans a couple years ago when wide receiver Stefon Diggs hauled in a pass from Case Keenum near the home sideline before sprinting into the end zone for a 61-yard touchdown to give Minnesota a 29-24 win over New Orleans in the Divisional Round of the play-offs?

The happy dance, a moment of pure joy.

Facilitating confirmation, when our ninth graders take ownership of the promises made before God by their parents and sponsors is similarly amazing.

Officiating at weddings – and I've done more than my fair share of them over the years – continues to be a blessing for me as I witness the sacrament that the Holy Spirit shares, as the groom is blessed by God through his bride, and the bride is blessed by God through her groom. This is second-order effect love: God shares and couples that understand this dynamic are setting themselves up for success for decades to come.

Ephesians 4:12 is often used in weddings: *Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves.*

*A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.*

When living our faith in Christ is a part of our marriages and our families, we are much more likely to weather the storms that this world keeps throwing at us. And we've had plenty of storms over the past couple of years. I'm sure our congregation is not alone in bringing the flock back together: I've been back from my deployment since last December and there are so many people I have yet to see.

In the Sermon on the Mount as recorded in the Gospel according to John, Jesus tells his followers that they are – and this is Chapter 6, verses 14 and 15, *“the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house.”*

Following Jesus isn't something that we do as Lone Rangers: We can only live our faith in relationship to one another.

Jesus summed up the whole of the law in Luke 10 by declaring *“Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind” and, “Love your neighbor as yourself.”*

This isn't a Sunday thing – this is an integral part of your life thing.

My question is how do you shine the Light of God into the world – and what do you do to ensure you have a healthy resupply of oil? How are we doing in fulfilling the promises we made to God at the baptisms of our children, godchildren, and grandchildren?

I've been praying about this letter for some time now, asking the Spirit to guide me a way that I don't go down the well-worn road of guiltling people into action.

My hope is that the Spirit uses this and our worship services on Sundays and Wednesdays (and the rest of our outreach activities) to build the Kingdom of God in ways that inspire and build faith and grow love.

At the heart of what we profess here as a people of God is the absolute truth that WE ARE SAVED BY GRACE THROUGH FAITH. Faith itself is a gift – we don't own it. Rather, it is given to us to live.

According to the Apostle Paul, *'Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ.'*

That was Romans 10:17.

That pretty much sums up why he and this other guy named Peter lead the charge on building the Arc that would carry the saving message of Jesus Christ through time – and that message is still being shared today.

It's really hard to do those sorts of things when you're hunkered down waiting for the storms to blow over – and this one seems to be dragging on and on. Sixteen months ago, give or take, we found ourselves on lonely islands.

I have no doubt it was hard for parents with small children to work from home. I know it was horrible for people in different occupational fields who lost hours or jobs. The kids and young adults whose world turned upside down and distance learning became a widespread reality: Months of no hanging out with friends or catching a glimpse of that boy or girl they maybe had their eye on. My heart continues to hurt for our elders – and anyone who went through serious health issues – without the ability to connect with their people, their tribe.

Unless we make a conscious decision to connect and maintain our fellowship with one another, we will fall away:

Think of Jesus going after the 1 sheep who wandered off one small patch of grass at a time – until he looked up and wondered, "Where'd everybody go?"

Think of the man or woman who, with the intervention of God, was able to put down the bottle and after a few months or years decides that he/she doesn't need to go to meetings any longer. The Crocodiles – the old timers in the AA program – would tell you that it's only a matter of time before they slip.

So where am I going with this?

I'm heading to the foot of the cross to thank God for you.

In every Baptism we do, one of our church elders shares John 6:16, the culminating verse after Jesus calls his followers Lights on a Hill: *"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."*

Do not be afraid. This pandemic storm will pass – but please know that there is always another storm on the horizon.

The current political situation will pass – but please know there will always be another pundit screaming at the top of his lungs about things we need to be afraid of.

The constant in all of this is not you or me or our children.

We continue to march forward through time, inching closer to the Kingdom of God (because we can't help but be changed when the Spirit is vested within us).

I thank God: He keeps his promises. He remembers His children.

In James 1:17: *Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change.* Hebrews 13: *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.*

In Christ, SSLC and so many other congregations are offering the opportunity to grasp on to and hold on to and grow into the Love of Jesus Christ.

Get busy. Live large and learn. Let's do what Jesus told us to do right before he ascended into Heaven: *"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."*



\*Baptisms allowed as private family events and during regular service.


