## PASTOR ALLISON



*“Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.” (Proverbs 3:5-6)*

Like many of us, I had heard this proverb about putting our faith and trust in God alone, numerous times over my life. In a spiritual sense, I always thought that I followed this advice to the letter. It has only been over these past few weeks as I recover from my shoulder surgery that I have realized just how far reaching that trust should be. I trust that God put the best doctors and medical staff for me in that operating room. But have I really trusted God when it comes to my health in general? I am not like those people who refuse medical care, believing that God will heal me if I am worthy enough. I am also not one of those people who refuse to go to the doctor because I am afraid of what the doctor might say, or because of a diagnosis I might receive. But I do not take care of myself, I do not listen to what I am told to do, lose weight, exercise more, reduce my stress and get more sleep. Forgetting that my body is God's, I'm only borrowing it for a few short years while I am walking this earth and since it is on loan to me, I have a responsibility to care for it just as I have a responsibility to care for all of God's creation.

We cannot and we do not know everything about everything there is to know about, no one can other than God. Therefore, God has given each of us our area of expertise. Doctors, nurses, researchers, therapists to heal, engineers, architects, painters, sculptors, composers and musicians to create, teachers, parents, grandparents to teach and nurture, everyone has a purpose in God's creation. The one thing our passions and talents have in common is that we cannot fulfill our full potential without God in our lives. Many people feel they are solely responsible for all their accomplishments, that no one, not even God has helped them become successful. It makes one wonder how much greater their success might be if they acknowledged God in their life.

We are instructed to acknowledge God in all our ways, acknowledge that God is present and active in all aspects of our lives. I had a seminary professor who once stated that he hoped God was not in every part of our lives because he felt God had much better, much more important things to focus on than the minutia of our lives. I disagree with my professor. My God is big enough, strong enough and loving enough to be with each of us in our smallest, least important moments as well as in our greatest, most intensely life changing moments. For it is in our small moments, our small decisions that we need God's guidance, small nudges, slight course corrections, always trusting that God is leading us. Remembering that God knows more than we can even conceive of and that God will not make our way harder, will not twist the path back upon itself, rather God straightens our path for a straight road is always easier to travel.

As the proverb writer states, we all need to trust God in every aspect of our lives, not just the spiritual one. God will make our journey easier, smoother, and will walk with us, all we have to do is to trust God more than ourselves.
