

SSLC Summer Worship Schedule beginning June 6:



8 a.m. – Sanctuary Service with Live Facebook Feed.

9 a.m. – Drive-In Service in the SSLC Parking Lot.

The Executive Committee of the SSLC Church Council found itself in a bit of a quandary as it worked with staff to set times for worship through the summer months of 2021. Historically, we have gone to a single worship service in the summer, and the initial plan was to do that again.

God has blessed and grown the Drive-In Service over the past several months and to go away from something that the Spirit is obviously pushing seemed wrong. Couple that with that fact that there are several households with immune-compromised members who attend that service and there are several reasons to keep it going.

The next question was when to do the Sanctuary Service: Not doing one was not an option. The earlier start will give individuals who would like to watch the video (on Facebook) on Sunday morning a larger window to do so, and families with small children tend to gravitate to earlier starts, as well.

The 10 a.m. time slot will be used on the First Sunday of each month for our planned “Jubilee” Kid/Family Friendly worship experiences through August, and can be used for baptismal rites, if the family wants to go that route. The Council has already started looking into Sunday Schedules for the fall, which will be shared as soon as they are set.

Book of Revelation Overview and Bible Study—Tuesdays through June 30

This means SSLC members can call in and participate or Zoom in and learn, as well. We will be utilizing a 7-week course produced by one of Pastor Thul's seminary professors, Dr. Craig Koester. Even in Martin Luther's era, more than 500 years ago, most Bible experts thought Revelation was a dangerous place for average church attendees to go – especially because the imagery and the prophetic nature of the book itself can easily lead to misinterpretation and misuse.

We will deal with things like the Rapture and the idea behind the Left Behind Series. More importantly, we will get into the message that the Holy Spirit was conveying to the seven churches when it was originally written, as well as the message the Spirit is sending us today.

*Office continues to be officially open on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, and Thursday (morning).


*Baptisms allowed as private family events and during regular service.



PASTOR DARYL'S MESSAGE

With numbers in decline, it appears the Pandemic is slowly dissipating in the United States. This cannot be said for other places in the world: India, Pakistan and several spots in South America are dealing with crisis beyond what we saw here, and our prayers continue for the Spirit to heal all of God's creation of this threat.

The hard work of many of our SSLC Family: Council, Small Group Leaders, PCN Team Leaders, Building and Grounds Committee Members, Quilters, Ushers, Readers, Worship Assistants, Musicians, Youth Leaders and Volunteers – have put us in a position to move boldly into the summer months sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ to our communities and beyond.



This is a picture of the backyard patio project that I have been working on for the better part of two weeks in my spare time – assisted by a couple of my adult sons. It is very much challenging work, physically. The cinder blocks weigh almost 75 pounds each, and the amount of dirt we've move is substantial.

I am not writing this for any other reason than to use it as an example of what it feels like to build the Kingdom of God: It is hard work. It is challenging work. It is important work. And it is also work that you might think you know something about, but somewhere along the line you realize that you are simply doing the best you can with the skills you have.

There are times when I work really hard for several hours and it looks like I haven't made any progress. If you multiply that feeling by 100, you'll start to understand that the Kingdom of God, one of Jesus' Hallmark touchpoints throughout his ministry, is a lot of work (and while God marches on, it's quite likely that we can't and won't see the progress from our vantage point).

"The Kingdom of God isn't coming with signs to be observed, nor will they say 'Here it is!' or 'There it is,'" Jesus told some Pharisees in the Gospel according to Luke, Chapter 17, "For Behold, the Kingdom of God is in your midst."

Yup. It's like my patio. The pieces are all in place, but it'll be a lot of work before it is set up and functioning like it will eventually. I'd love to say you are called to help me with my patio – but truly you aren't. You are being challenged by God to assist the Spirit in Kingdom building: Read the Bible, Pray, Attend Worship, Share generously, give sacrificially, and love beyond your closest circle: Engage the world with the Love that God has showered down upon you.


