Confirmation

Confirmation Sunday is April 11 and we have 6 ninth graders who will be affirming the promises that their parents and godparents made at their baptisms. This is a highlight of our church year and we will ensure that guests will be able to see/hear the praise and worship if our sanctuary fills beyond our allowed capacity.

First Communion

First Communion is truly a great milestone in our children's' lives and we will be celebrating Holy Communion with our First Graders, as well as any older children who have yet to make their First Communion.

In order to receive the Sacrament, the child is required to attend one of two classes on Holy Communion with a parent/godparent. We've scheduled the classes for March 21 and March 28, both at 1130 a.m. in the Narthex here at church. The classes generally run about 90 minutes.

Note: It is the parents' decision if their child is prepared for this moment. If you have concerns, or not sure, please connect with Pastor Daryl and he will walk through the process with you. We've had many families wait a year or two for various reasons.

Community Celebration

Directed by the SSLC Church Council, the fourth Sunday in April will be dedicated to praising God for so many incredible things that have happened over the past year-plus. In addition to asking for the Holy Spirit to extend God's reach to- and through our people, we will be celebrating God's Hands at work in so many people who have been instrumental in our continued viability through a really challenging time. Additionally, we will look to ensure that all our Kingdom Kids who have come into their milestone years receive their special items.

For those of you who don't know this tradition, SSLC gives a faith chest, a fleece receiving blanket and a baby/toddler friendly Bible at Baptisms. We are currently in the process of rebuilding our stock of chests, so anyone interested in taking a role can reach out to David Darsow for more information. The blankets are just a small part of what our quilters do: If you are interested in this, please call Shelly.

The next Bible shared is with children who are normally entering kindergarten. These precious young ones are given the Children's Illustrated Bible for them to use with their families as they learn to read.

Fourth Graders are the next stop on our Milestone Road, and they receive the Brick Bible, which has turned into a hit with the kids, as well as their older and younger siblings. The thing you should know about this Bible is that it is a picture book that tells many of the important stories in both the Old and New Testaments using Legos and all the colors.

Finally, as seventh graders begin our three-year confirmation program in seventh grade, they receive the "Colaborate" Bible - which is built to weather backpacks and getting moved about regularly. There's also plenty of room in the margin area for notes. Kids can expect that by the time they affirm their Baptism, the Bible will be highlighted, noted and well loved!

If your child is in one of the windows to receive a Bible and has yet to do so (or someone didn't get it last year), please give Carla Griffin or Shelly Bluhm a call and we will make sure to include these gifts as a part of this special Worship Service.



PASTOR DARYL'S MESSAGE

The PCN Initiative: It's Prayer/Care Time!



White noise means a whole lot more than being stuck between stations on FM radio trying to find a baseball game or your favorite station. Physicists would tell you that the definition of white noise is random noise with a flat spectral density throughout the audible frequency range of 20 to 20,000 Hertz.

Simplified, it's background noise.

When I was in Iraq, the background noise included the sound of diesel generators, the hum of tires coming from the highway just off the camp, the engines of vehicles, muffled music coming from different billets and air traffic. I got accustomed to it, but you need to know this was a lot louder than the sound of my furnace or air blowing through the vent by my side of the bed in my home when I wake up in the middle of the night these days.

I would like to use the term "White Noise" in how it relates to the messages and information that all of us are bombarding with constantly – in so many ways. It can be overwhelming. So many different things are competing for your attention (and your time and money) that it can all mesh together into a block of unintelligible gibberish.

That's sensory overload and it is a common thing these days.

SSLC Secretary Shelly Bluhm and I try to limit the number of emails we send in the hope that the ones we do send will be read. While so many churches have gone to 100 percent digital newsletter, we still mail them out: What we've found is that they stand a much better chance of being read this way.

We have transitioned well through the pandemic so far and I look forward to truly working side-by-side in this next chapter, but we're going to need to rally our troops first. That will involve dedicated effort into building community and the Holy Spirit has laid on it our heart to do so person-to-person.

I'll explain.

I knew I'd need to catch up with people and what's gone on in their lives since I left at the end of July 2019 – but what I didn't know was that Covid-19 and the inability for us to worship in person for so long would put many of our congregation members out on lonely islands and that a lot of communication between friends and family slowed down and/or stopped.

The SSLC Church Council and I have been working on a plan to improve our connectivity with one another to better care for one another: The Prayer/Care Network.

If you are reading this, it is highly likely that you will be receiving a call from a member of SSLC in the coming couple weeks to say that you are part of his/her PCN Team.

To some extent, you could also call this initiative the “Bad News Bearers,” because one of the functions of splitting the congregation into units of 6 Households is to easily share news in the best way possible. We recently mourned the death of one of our own and the traditional way of letting people know on Sunday certainly did not go far.



Another function of the teams will be to help the pastor(s) know what is going on. It makes my heart sink when someone tells me that they’ve been in the hospital or sick or grieving – and I knew nothing about it. Calling a pastor can make people feel like what they are going through is more serious than they, themselves want to believe so often they do not call until they can talk about it in the past tense.

We want to support our people into the valley and beyond, and knowing one another’s story is essential. As team members, you will know the name of your captain, as well as the other people on your bench. The hope is that connections are made and built over time, and we can support one another.

Of course, the hotline straight to me is always available and I encourage everyone to use it. You are not going to waste my time. My business is sharing Jesus into and beyond our community: It is a people business. God is in the People Business and as his called and ordained minister here – you are certainly my highest priority. You matter. We matter to God.

“Let us consider how to stir up on another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day drawing near.”

Hebrews 10:24-25

Right now meeting together isn’t an option for many of us, but we can break through the white noise of our day in only one way as I see it: Believer-to-believer connections.

We can even build the Kingdom this way. It’s how Peter and Paul got this thing started so many years ago!
