FROM PASTOR DARYL

About the time this newsletter hits your mailbox, I will be a week into my Autumn Pain Tour: I developed a toothache last Thursday morning and by Friday morning it was bad. My dentist was not in the office, but the manager instructed me to come in – that if it was something that would require a referral, they could do X-rays and route it through my dentist to perhaps speed up the process.



So I did. Sure enough, a cloudy area near the roots of my topside left back molar suggested that it was indeed, root canal time. I grew up in the pre-fluoride era (as well as in the time of impact drills that created microfractures that only later were replaced).

The Endodontist office didn't call until Monday afternoon. They didn't take my insurance and I would need to pay cash up front and submit the claim to my own insurance myself. I told the woman that I had figured out a Tylenol/Ibuprofen schedule that allowed me to at least be coherent, and that I would pass.

The closest orthodontist who takes my insurance is in the Twin Cities. It's Wednesday morning and I am waiting at home for a call, hopefully wearing sweatshirt and sweatpants – thinking they might say "Come on down." If I don't hear anything by 10:30, I'll put on pants and head to the office.

True story: Sunday morning between services Shelly watched me walk into the office and say "What's wrong with your neck? Your movement seems different." I told her the situation and laughed.

Why am I sharing this pain with you?

I really don't want sympathy and for you to feel sorry for me. I'm a big boy. I'll survive.

What I want to do is use it to explain that this is how sin works, too.

When we have a problem, we generally ignore it and hope it'll go away. Sins and toothaches don't work that way. And like a cavity or an infection, the sin might start small but will continue to grow and spread until it basically consumes all of our attention and yeah ... it can hurt.

Unlike dental pain, sin also hurts other people. This also gets worse over time.

Unlike your poor pastor, who needed a orthodontist referral and a second referral (and who knows, possibly a third referral), you have the ability and capacity to connect directly with the only one who can heal your broken: God. As a bonus, you don't have to drive to the Cities. God is on your speed dial: Just interlace your hands and call him up.

From Matthew 11: 27-29:

Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.

It does not say "Only if you didn't cause your own weariness or only if you aren't finding ways to burden yourself."

This is God calling us sinners to Him. The orthodontist ought to call me to him. Just saying.

Note to Seniors: We are looking for households who have yardwork or other things that our High School and Confirmation Students can assist you with. This is not about pride: This is allowing our young men and women to share God's love and live their faith in action. Please call pastor or Shelly if you have something along these lines.

*Baptisms allowed as private family events and during regular service.


*Homebound visits resume based on individual's comfort level.
